Key Responsibilities:

- Develop skills in managing a paediatric caseload; including assessment and treatment
- Utilise evidence-based interventions that focus on building the functional skills of the individual and their supporting network
- Build professional networks within the Eyre Peninsula to support the client centred practice at Tobruk Centre.
- In conjunction with a supervisor develop programs and evaluate clinical competencies and client outcomes.

- Travel with a team member to school and regional sites across Lower Eyre Peninsula
- Be involved with Tobruk Centre projects that address service delivery gaps and community development
- Contribute to quality improvement programs within Tobruk Centre for Children's Development

Graduate and Early Career Speech Pathologist Program:

 - Work shadowing with experienced clinician for all initial appointments
 - Supervision that involves jointly developing intervention plans for all clients
 - o 1 day a week (equivalent) planning
 - o Introductory training in Learn to Play and Early Start Denver Model
 - o 2 extra days of leave and funded return airfare to Adelaide
- 4-9months of employment
 - o Ongoing twice weekly supervision sessions
 - Commence outreach visits jointly with experienced clinician
 - o Increase in independence with caseload management of up to 4 sessions per day
 - Maintain 1 day a week (equivalent) planning time
 - Set annual professional development plan
 - Conduct initial assessment sessions on own
 - Able to take leave in advance
